## The CSAT and The New Media: A Call to Action

### Phone Sex and Olden Days

Until very recently 1988 - 1998 could have been called *The Golden Age of Phone Sex*. Way back then, perhaps you remember, mostly male callers would spend from two minutes to two days lingering at home or the office, paying to talk, talk, talk about life, love and most of all, S-E-X. Back in those pre-chat room, pre-porn site, pre-web cam and most of all pre-cell phone days, pay for play, talk dirty by-the-\$1.98-minute was all the rage. In an age where *safe sex* reigned supreme with no HIV treatment yet on the horizon, hot, sterile, copper-wire connections were the fastest way to get off and get on with your day –no mess no fuss and undeniably safe. You may remember the back stories about the millions being made by those investors savvy enough to snap up and market phone numbers like 1-800-Hot-4Sex or 1-800-ALL-GIRL, not to mention the 68 year-old grannies and 220 lb stay-at-home moms, making extra moola on the side playing the part of lonely, understanding 24 year old hotties. Ahh, the good old days... Sadly, as we know, those with sex addiction and related problems were then spending countless hours and thousands of dollars monthly to maintain their obsessive, tele-sex habits, paying off the huge bills at month's-end, only to rack up even more sex-debt in the following days and weeks on another credit card or phone bill. Hours spent on the phone with anonymous strangers was also time *not spent* in recreation and with family – and for many the losses went far beyond the financial.

### Phone Sex and the New Media

Fast-forward to 2011 and *The Second Golden*

*Age of Phone Sex*. Un-tethered from the wall socket and streaming from your hand- to cell-tower- to satellite and back, phone sex is today fully visual, often free and for the vulnerable among us -highly addictive. With Smartphones that GPS locate and apps like Ashley Madison or Grindr guiding the search –finding a nearby sex partner in-vivo is as easy and anonymous as looking for a good Italian restaurant. Within 15 seconds or less of starting the app (for real) you can find who-ever-you-want, where-ever-you-are. And potential hook-ups are conveniently listed by closest geo-location, thank you very much. In addition there is now live video streaming available on the newest smartphones that offers real-time mutual face-to-face communication, potentially a boon for long-distance relationships and those who want to see their grandkids from afar, but not likely so great for marital fidelity, video-chat prostitution and those who struggle with sex and romantic addictions. So what does this all mean? In essence- not a lot for those stable, healthy folks who can pass on that extra piece of cake and skip the fries when they want to. But for those with a propensity for impulsive and addictive pleasure seeking, it is already a whole new world of problems – all over again.

### A Call to Action

To those who treat impulsive, compulsive and addictive sexual behavior problems the information above isn't offered simply as a playful reflection on our rapidly changing times, but rather as a call to action. To be effective at what we do and for our clients to feel we "get" their problem we must be poised at the leading edge of our field.

To treat sexual addiction in 2011 while remaining unaware of- and unfamiliar with- the technologies our clients increasingly utilize to access romantic intensity, pornography and casual sexual encounters are a set-up for potentially inadequate assessment and under-informed treatment plans. Lest this seem provocative, un-empathic or unkind consider the following: How often would you refer to the surgeon who remains uninvolved in the latest computer guided surgical techniques because she doesn't understand them, finds them overwhelming or thinks that what she already knows is "good enough"? If your loved one had cancer, would you send them to the oncologist who utilizes genetic cancer cell mapping to create a targeted chemotherapy regimen or to the physician who has yet to incorporate this skill set? While it is both understandably human and quaint to believe that age and experience can fill in the gap between us and our changing technological world – these are the kinds of beliefs can quickly make us irrelevant, under-informed and less than the highly skilled clinicians we all aspire to be.

Fine, so where do I gain this information you ask? Who will teach me? How do I find the time? The answer is simple, but not easy. In this world of new technology you are the best teacher you can have. Start by turning on your computer and searching Goggle for the phrase "sex apps" or "GPS locator sex" to see what you can learn. Buy a smart phone and use it, this is a necessary luxury for us. Create your own account on twitter and facebook or myspace and start posting information about your work. If an 11-year old can do this, then so can you. Mind you, I'm not asking anyone to risk their sobriety to be current, you can gain the necessary familiarity and skill-set needed here by using similar phone-apps to find movies, restaurants and make travel arrangements. It's the process and access that you need to understand, that and the names of the problem applications (i.e. Ashley Madison, Grinder, her etc.), which you can simply research online. Truth be told- 'being where our clients are' takes the same time, patience and a commitment that we already ask on a daily basis of those we treat. It's a kind of parallel process. Try to avoid any tendency here to be dismissive, defensive or angry- change itself actually is quite simple, just get started. I truly look forward to each one of us making our voices heard out there on the happy road to destiny - in the twitter-verse. It's a lot of fun once you get over the inevitable resistance to change that we all share - and my sincere congrats to those of you who have already begun finding your way. I'll see you out there soon.

# CSAT Spotlight -

Robert W. Webster, NCC, LPC, CMAT

## 1. Tell us a little about yourself – where you live, family, education, hobbies, etc.

I grew up in a suburb of Chicago with my parents, and younger brother and sister. After retiring from the Marine Corps, Bobbi (my wife of 23 years) and I, along with our two children (Carl – 18, and Morgan – 14) settled down in New Bern, NC.

I received my Bachelor of Science in Psychology from Georgia Southwestern State University in Americus GA, and my Master of Science in Psychology (Counseling Specialty) from Capella University. I am a National Certified Counselor, NC-Licensed Professional Counselor, and Certified Multiple Addictions Counselor (Sex and Chemical addictions)

Our family hobbies center around things outdoors. Bobbi and I both coach girl's lacrosse and, as a family, we have always been heavily involved in Scouting (both Boy and Girl). With this, we love to camp and play in the woods, rock-climb, or generally try to disappear in the mountains. Oh, did I mention we all hang-glide and are certified USHPA pilots?

## 2. Tell us about your path to becoming a therapist. What obstacles have you had to overcome?

My path to becoming a therapist was interesting. During the time I was racing triathlon, I became fascinated with the mental aspect of the sport. When I returned to college, I had aspirations of becoming a sport psychologist and working with athletes from both team and individual sports. In my undergrad work I took a course in Counseling Theories as an elective; I was hooked! When I applied for Graduate School my focus switched to counseling.

The main challenge I had in becoming a therapist was being a "non-traditional" student. It was very challenging to fit education, work and family into a 24-hour day. I could not have overcome this challenge were it not for the support of my wife and family.

## 3. Do you believe that there is still a stigma surrounding sex addiction?

In my practice I still see a LOT of stigma surrounding sex addiction. In general, and this is true with both lay-people and professionals, there is a huge misunderstanding about what sex addiction is, and what it is not. It is not unusual for me to have to educate people who believe any behaviors "they feel" are inappropriate equate sex addiction (even those that could equate with "normal/healthy" sexual behaviors) or those who feel sex addiction is something used to "justify" behaviors or alleviate consequences.



I also feel that we still live in an environment where being an Alcoholic or Drug addict is more socially accepted than being a sex addict. I feel these two areas are related and with further research and education will come a higher level of mainstream acceptance.

## 4. Tell us about your practice – types of clients you see, tools you utilize, what is working for your clients.

My primary practice is in a facility dedicated to active duty military and their family members. Recently I have opened a small private practice (New Pathways Recovery Center, PLLC) in New Bern, NC.

I tend to use a lot of self report inventories in my practice. Though a little time consuming, in addition to the SAST-R, I have found having my clients complete a depression and anxiety inventory along with the Life Events Scale helps me gain a much better understanding of my client and how they are being impacted. I regularly also use the SDI-R with my addicts. In addition to gaining a better understanding of my client's behaviors I have also found this to be an excellent tool when addressing relapse scenarios and triggers!

Due to the structure and direction it provides, I have found the task approach to be VERY successful with both my military and civilian clients. I have also found success in addressing the various tasks from a "life change model." In this, I help the client see how recovery is not an event, but rather a new way of approaching life in general and how the tasks should be used with all aspects of

## 5. What are your future goals for your practice?

In addition to building my private practice, I am looking forward to adding other tasks to my CMAT certification. I have completed the CMAT chemical tasks, and am very excited about adding: offender, eating, and other process related tasks to my certification. In addition to this, I am trying to find a way to fit EMDR training into my future plans.

**6. Are you treating clients of both sexes? If so, does the treatment differ between the sexes?**

I have only had the opportunity to work with a couple of female addicts. Though it would lack statistical significance, I have found the level of shame to be much greater in the few female clients I have treated.

**7. Are you interested in research/new findings, etc., about sex addiction?**

I am always interested in research and new findings. I feel these areas only serve to strengthen our work and the overall acceptance of sex addiction.

**8. What do you see for the future in sex addiction therapy?**

Acceptance and understanding.

**9. Are you active in your community? Tell us about it.**

I have started reaching out to other professionals and organizations within my area to provide education about sex addiction. This has been a slow process but I am starting to receive speaking requests.

**10. What are some things about you that the CSAT community doesn't know.**

Not only am I a retired Marine, but also a former Marine Drill Instructor. Contrary to what some may say, having a former Drill Instructor (Sergeant) as a therapist is NOT a bad idea; and for the record, I've never offered to take a client on a trip to "Mamby-Pamby land." ☺
